Description:

The building referred to as “The Hobart/Barr/Lucking House”, is associated with distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction. The residence is described as a 1-1/2 story structure and an example of the Colonial Revival style with its slanted bay and classical dentils dividing upper and lower windows. The front porch is covered by a hip roof with gabled dormer and supported by Doric columns. The 200 block of South Ash Street is also noted to represent “a transition in styles ranging from Victorian Vernacular of the 1890s to the Colonial Revival of the early 1900s and the California Bungalows of the 1920s.” Franklin and Julia Cook Hobart settled in Ventura and built their house between 1892 and 1905. Mr. Frank Hobart became a justice of the peace and Mrs. Hobart an active member of the Eastern Star and Woman’s Relief Corp.
