

# Java Map - Map Export Options

While “printing” of the Java Map is not possible, there are some options for exporting the map. The diagram below shows how to access the *Map Export Options* panel.

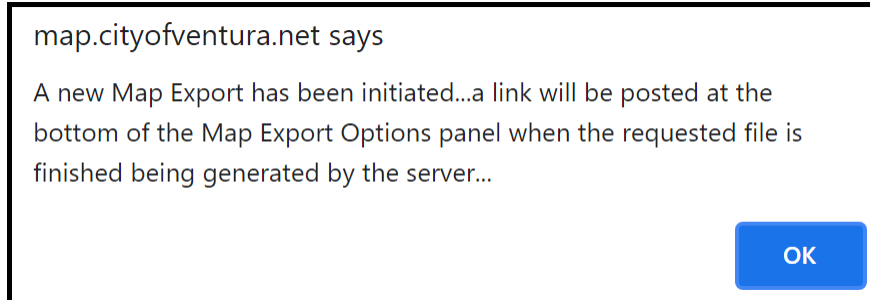

The *Map Export Options* panel consists of four gray rows for setting parameters for the export, and a green row with the button for initiating the export process. The parameter settings are as follows:

1. A text box where you can type an optional Map Title for the exported map
2. A choice of export formats: **JPG** or **PDF**
3. A choice of page sizes: **Letter** or **Tabloid**
4. A choice of page orientations: **Landscape** or **Portrait**

For items 2, 3, and 4, the option shown in white text is the current setting. To choose the other option, click on that option, and it will change to white, becoming the new current setting for that parameter.

Once all parameters are set, click on the words “EXPORT MAP” to begin the export process. This will send the request to the server and cause the following message to appear:



Click the blue “OK” button and a new section will appear at the bottom of the *Map Export Options* panel where any exports that have been initiated are listed, each row ending with the status of the export file as being either “Pending...” or “Ready!”. Here is an example of what this looks like for an export that is pending:



And here is what it looks like when the export process has finished processing:



Once the process has finished, the item on the list for that export becomes a link to open the resulting file in a new tab. From there, you can save the export file to a location of your choosing or make a printout on whatever printer you can access. Please note that the server where these export files are generated treats these files as temporary files, which will be deleted automatically. If you need to keep the exported map, then saving the file is highly recommended.

## Known Limitations of this Export Process:

Although we do not know what causes this limitation, we have learned that this export process does not support the presentation of any of the *Optional Map Layers*. Only the *Aerial Photo Layers* and *City Basemap Layers* will show up on the exported map. If you need a snapshot of exactly what is on the screen, try “**Alt-PrtSc**” to copy the active window into the clipboard and then paste (“**Ctrl-V**”) the contents of the clipboard into another program, like *Paint* or *Word*.
